Carnegie will be honoured posthumously as a Builder

(Toronto, Ontario and Boston, Mass. June 27, 2022)- The Carnegie Initiative is proud to announce that the Hockey Hall of Fame has named Herb Carnegie a 2022 Inductee as a Builder, in recognizing his work to make hockey inclusive and accepting.

"We are elated that my father's work is being recognized," Co-Founder Bernice Carnegie said. "Thank you to the Hockey Hall of Fame for this honour. My father wanted everyone to enjoy the game he loved so much and spent his life developing. He influenced the lives of thousands of children and we are proud to carry on his legacy, both through our family and The Carnegie Initiative."

Carnegie joins Daniel Alfredsson, Roberto Luongo, Riikka Sallinen, Daniel Sedin and Henrik Sedin who will be inducted in the Player Category.

"For decades, Herb Carnegie did the work to make hockey more inclusive, and to see him be recognized with this honour by the Hockey Hall of Fame is amazing," Co-Founder Bryant McBride said. "When we started The CI, we committed to continuing that work and we are excited to bring our second annual CI Summit to Toronto in January 2023, on the heels of Herb's induction into the Hockey Hall of Fame."

The 2022 Hockey Hall of Fame Induction Celebration will take place from Friday, Nov. 11 – Monday, Nov. 14.
